DRESS CODE

All St. Davids School members are expected to dress appropriately for an academic setting and contribute to an overall positive image of our school. Short shorts, miniskirts, cut-offs, or t-shirts with inappropriate messages are not acceptable. (For the correct length of shorts, students are asked to extend their arm down to check that the shorts meet their thumb.) Straps on student tops must be at least two to three fingers wide with no undergarments showing. Students will be asked to change or put on a jacket if clothing is inappropriate.

Supporting The Growth of Your Children Over the Summer

Recent research strongly supports the need for children to continue reading and writing during the summertime. Studies indicate that in order to maintain gains made during the school year, children must keep up a learning routine when not in school. We all realize that one of the most exciting things about summer is all the time children have to pursue their interests, such as sports, summer camps and time with friends. But please make time to explore and expand upon these interests by shared experiences, reading and writing. One of the most beneficial things that parents can do is to help their children develop background knowledge which allows them to make links between what they know and what they are learning. Here are ideas to help your child enrich background knowledge through fun summer experiences.

- Read a book that takes place in another part of the country or world. It's a great way to experience new places. For example, look at a map of Canada with your child and talk about the parts of the country he or she would like to visit. Then search on-line or visit your local library to learn more about that region; for example national parks and historic sites. The whole world awaits!
- Visit a local museum or historical site. Check your newspaper's weekend listings or information about museums and exhibits near you. Go to the local library to find historical sites in your area or engaging stories about the past. Learning about the past is another way to leave the everyday world behind while still in town.
- Travel to the stars. The night sky is fascinating, not only to kids but to adults too. If you can't head north, pitch a tent in the backyard and look up at the stars. Can you find the Big Dipper or the North Star? Tell stories late into the night. Can't get away? Take a trip to the stars with the help of a good book about the planets and the stars.
- Enjoy the great outdoors. Take time to hike, swim, catch fireflies, look at birds or plants, or just meander through your neighbourhood, making sure to talk about where you're going, what you see and sharing what you did with other family members or friends. Visit area parks, playgrounds, trails, horticultural centres, or beaches. 'Visit' the wilderness by reading.

Niagara Student Transportation Services (NSTS) is a consortium between the District School Board of Niagara and the Niagara Catholic District School Board. The mandate of NSTS is to plan and manage safe, efficient and effective transportation services for the students of Niagara. NSTS is open all summer planning the 2011-2012 transportation routes. You can find your child's transportation eligibility information, bus stop location and times on the NSTS website in late August for the 2011-2012 school year. You will need your child's Ontario Education Number (OEN) which is located on your child's report card to log-on to the secure website. For JK students who have not been assigned an OEN, a letter will be mailed directly to your home if your student is eligible for transportation. Please note, this organization is **subject to change** should our enrollment or staffing change in the fall. If you have a request to make regarding class placement for your son/daughter based on significant educational merit, please submit this **in writing to Mrs. Giroux by June 15th** and/or make an appointment to speak to Mrs. Giroux so that we can factor this information in to our decision-making.

Student Placement Policy

As staff changes and student demographics may result in the necessity of split grades in some classes across the school, it is important that parents understand the process used to identify students who would be placed in a particular class. When split classes occur, the following criteria will apply when decisions about student placement are made:

- The student's learning style
- The student's social maturity
- The student's ability to undertake some work with relative independence
- The student's attitude toward, and commitment to, school work
- The student's organizational skills
- The student's peer relationships
- The student's need for specific type(s) of role models
- The number of identified special needs of I.E.P students in one class
- Separation of siblings where suitable
- Resulting class size

Depending on student needs, the priority given to one or more of these criteria may vary.
